- Sub :- Expansion of Teachers' Trining Facilitles at Primary stage providing Universal Free and Compulsory Primary Education in the Third Five Year Plan-Central Scheme.

The undersigned is directed to say that to meet the requirements fo the Univ rsal, Free and Compulsory Primary Education during the Third Five Year Flan, the Government of India formulated concrete R proposals fro pex providing additional facilities for training of Primary School Teachers, so as to cover upto a maximum of half the mm number of teachers required during the Third Flan. The Government of India also laid down certain scales of expenditure and agreed to keep bear 100% of the cost of the scheme during 1959-60 and 1960-61 if training schemes were formulated in conformity with those principles.

- 2. In pursuance of the pre principles as laid down by the Govt. of India, concrete schemes for e-ansicn of Frimary teachers' Training facilities (Basic E raining and Primary Training) at a total cost not exceeding Ms. 11-93 ladhs (recurring ultimate) were drawn up and submitted to the Government of India.
- The Government of India have in their latter No.F.42-8/59
  B.I. dated the 4th September, 1959 (copy enclosed) approved the
  following schemes for additional training facilities in this state:—
  - Expansion of existing nine (\*)
     Junior Basic Training Colleges 320 seats.
  - Setting up of nine (9) new Junior Basic Trining Colleges -1080 seats (120 seats in each)
  - Expansion of mm existion twelve (12) Primary Training Schools-660 seats.

The Government of India have mit also approved an expenditure of Rs, 53,35,400/- for the implementation of the schemes on accommodat ion both teaching and residential, furniture, books etc. on the scales according to their pattern as indicated in the appendix to their latter with the stipulation that any excess over the approved pattern is met from the State Plan provision.

The Government of india have further authorised an expenditure of %s. 26,67,700/- during the year 1959-60 from the "Ways and Means Advances" the Central grant being teleased in accordance with the Finance (Ecomomic Affairs Ed Department ) Ministry's %s letter No. F,2(17) P.11/56 dated the 12th may, 1958.

4. The Bovernment is new pleased to sanction the immediate implementation of the three schemes mentioned ove during the current financial year with the estimated non-recuring and recurring arms costs as datailed in the schedule enclosed.

The nine (9) new Junior Basic Training Colleges may be set up as Government institutions and may be located at at the places shown. The requisite land, preferably 6 acres or more where agriculture is one on the Basic Crafts and not less than 4 acres in other Institutions should be doneted by the bocal people by registered deed.

The names of the institutions under the two empansion

schemes will be intimated later.

The construction works involved in regard to all Government Institutions should be undertaken by the Chief Ingineer, Construction Board in accordance with the approved plans and estimates subject to the ceilings indicated inclusive of sanitation, watersupply, electrification, etc.

Sanction of the Governor is also accorded to the opening of a new subhead "Expansion of Teachers' Training Facilities at Primary stage for providing Maximum Universal Exem Free and Compulsory rimary Education in the Third Five ear Plan" under the head "Expenses out of the grant from the Government of India for Centrally sponsored Schemes Outside the State Plan" in the "37-Education Budget."

The charges on items other than construction projects for Government institutions will be debited to this bead, necessary funds being provided later on by reappropriation or

otherwise in due course.

- 6. The opening of a similar head, is also hereby sanctioned under "Centrally Sponsored Schemes outside the State lan-Education' in the 81-6.A. Budget to accommodate the charges involved in the schemes on sonstfuction projects for the Government institutions.
- 7. The Works and Buildings are Department of this Government have been requested to place necessary funds at the disposal of the Chief +Engineer, Construction Board on requisition to enable there to proceed with the inmm immediate implementation of the s schemes.
- 8. The Accountant General, West Bengal have been informed.
  9. Supara separate order will issue regarding other Expansion schemes.
